Checklist for Completed Application

- Application.** Apply online at sjcds.net. Applications submitted after February 1 will be considered on the availability of space.
- Schedule a Student Visit*.** Applicants are required to either visit (Grades 1 through 12) or interview as part of the application process. Please contact the Office of Admissions to schedule your student's appointment.
- Testing.** All students are required to take an entrance assessment:
 - Applicants for Pre-K3 through Grade 1 will take an admission assessment with an administrator. Please contact the Office of Admissions to schedule your student's assessment.
 - Applicants for Grades 2 through 12 take the Independent School Entrance Exam (ISEE). More information about the ISEE can be found at iseetest.org.
 - Applicants entering Grades 2 through 4, please contact the Office of Admission to schedule your student's ISEE.
 - Applicants entering Grades 5 through 12, please complete registration and payment online at iseetest.org. St. Johns' test center code is 101275. Please contact the Office of Admissions to discuss other potential testing options.
- Grades.** Submit the most recent copy of the student's report card, transcript, or grade report.
- Applicant Assessment Forms*.** To be completed by student's current English and math teachers and returned directly to St. Johns by current school.

Optional

- Merit Scholarship Application.** Application is due February 28. ISEE must be completed and scores available prior to scholarship deadline.
- Financial Aid.** To be considered for financial aid, families must complete the SSS Parents' Financial Statement (PFS) by May 31. The Financial Application and instructions are available online at sjcds.net.
